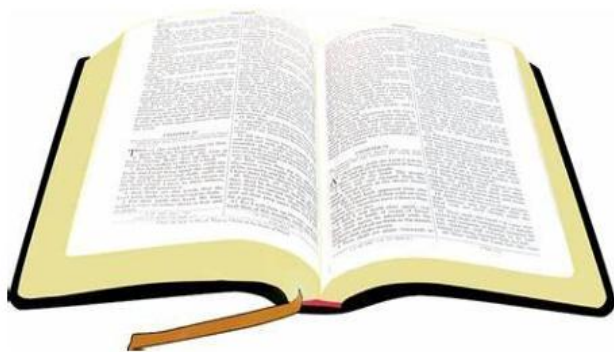

# Exploring the Bible

## The Book of Ezekiel

After the well-received series on Jeremiah in Lent, we thought it would be good to consider Ezekiel. Ezekiel was born before the exile but as a young man was deported to Babylon. He was a visionary, and his prophecies deal both with the reasons for the Exile but also in the conviction that God would renew and recreate his people. Many of his words are important for the New Testament. Most of all, Ezekiel reminds us that God is Sovereign – he is the One who is enthroned over all.
