Hello friends!

¡Feliz Navidad y Felices Fiestas!

We send you warm greetings from Bolivia and we'd like to share our gratitude for your generous and prayerful support that allows us to join the Lord in his mission here. It's been an amazing year of God's faithfulness!

This year we're celebrating our 10th Christmas in Santa Cruz. It's been fun to reflect on our previous Bolivian Christmas celebrations; candlelight services and Messy Church in the parks, cookie decorating classes and parties, failed Yorkshire puds (humidity), Christmases serving in the mission in the north of the city, our first "proper" Bolivian Christmas Eve, when we ate dinner at 12.30am, got home at 3am and attended Christmas Day service at 9am with only 15 people – Christmas Day here isn't like it is in the UK!

Remembering the alternative Christmas trees we've "created" – fairy lights hung on a wall in the shape of a tree, a large fallen tree branch cemented into a pot, spray-painted and decorated by our girls, a large potted palm tree which we covered in fairy lights and later planted in our garden – what beautiful and cherished memories!

With much anticipation and expectation wrapped up in **how** we celebrate Christmas, I've been reflecting on **why** we celebrate the arrival of Emmanuel, God with us, and his anticipated return. "Much more than a countdown," the Bible Project writes, "Advent embraces the way of Jesus and encourages hopeful waiting, courageous peace-making, resilient joy, and self-giving love in our still-suffering world."

In a few of our link letters, I've shared a bit about our friend Adviento (Advent in Spanish), but I've been waiting for this season of Advent to share more about his journey with Jesus.

A Bolivian Advent story...

Last Christmas, in the Bible study community in the toilets hosted by our microfinance partners Jenny and Richard, I shared the meaning of Advent. One of the men, Alejandro, who had only been attending for a few months and hardly said much, exclaimed loudly, "My name is Adviento, yes, that's my name!" while passing around his photo ID card for all to see. He was clearly excited! That day, as he learned the significance of his name, something moved in him. We saw it in his eyes and later, we could all see it in his heart and life.



Richard and Adviento, who have been friends for 35 years, met as teenage boys. Their friendship later embraced a life of drugs, alcohol and living rough on the streets. Many years and difficult trials later, Richard was the first to turn from that life and embrace the way of Jesus. For years, he kept inviting Adviento to do the same. Then one day in late summer 2024, Adviento accepted Richard's invitation to join the Bible study. Upon reflection, I'm deeply impacted by Richard's hope and faith in Jesus, which wouldn't let him give up on his friend, because he knows Jesus didn't give up on him, either.

Sadly, Adviento's many years of life on the streets took a mighty toll on his body, specifically his lungs.

He was in and out of hospital for the eight months that we knew him. We saw him getting thinner, yet he seemed stronger, growing in his knowledge and joy of the Lord as his body weakened. He faithfully attended the Bible study community every Friday when he wasn't in hospital. He couldn't read, but he attentively listened to God's Word. On one occasion when visiting Adviento in the emergency TB ward, as we were about to pray, I noticed a Bible on the bed. When Andrew went in after me - we had to go in separately - Adviento was trying to read the Bible, sounding out each letter like a child, while Andrew listened and helped him. He told Andrew he knew the end of his life was near, but he was ok because he felt the Lord's peace and presence in the midst of his pain and suffering. The Lord was doing a deep work in him and through him. The people in Adviento's street community didn't quite understand the significant change in his life. They knew him as a hopeless, violent drunk, similar to themselves, impossible to change. So when the Bible study community asked them for help in covering his medical costs, they refused. However, weeks later, several went to Richard with money to support Adviento. Through the hope and faith of others, Adviento's street community got a glimpse of the love of Jesus in this still-suffering world, of why we celebrate Emmanuel, God with us and as we wait for his promised return.

Our friend and brother in Christ Adviento passed away in May. We miss him, his big smile and his quiet steady faith, but we rejoice in the knowledge that Jesus came to this world as his and our Saviour!
